There is goodness in His power.



From the Preacher's Pen

TURNING IT OVER TO GOD

The Bible is filled with characters who exemplify qualities that we should all emulate. For a moment, let us consider Hannah, the wife of Elkanah. We learn in 1 Samuel 1:2 that Hannah was unable to have

children. For Hannah, as with many other women, this created a situation of great sadness in her life. To make matters worse, Elkanah's other wife, Peninnah, picked on Hannah for she had no children (1 Samuel 1:7). Because of her inability to have children and the constant nagging of Peninnah, Hannah cried and refused to eat.

With so many people, the story might have ended there, but the remainder of 1 Samuel reveals what Hannah did to alleviate her suffering. While Hannah and the household of Elkanah were at Shiloh, Hannah went to the temple and offered prayers to God. In her prayer, she offered a vow and made a request of God (1 Samuel 1:11). She asked the Lord to give her a son, and in return, she would give her son back to Jehovah God. Such a request and vow might seem incredible, but Hannah was resigned to honor God with the blessing He bestowed upon her. After a few words of encouragement from Eli (1 Samuel 1:17), Hannah went on about her business and felt no more sadness (1 Sam. 1:18).

There are several things that impress me about this story. Hannah turned her sad situation over to God in prayer. 1 Sam.1:11 "Then she made a vow and said, "O LORD of hosts, if You will indeed look on the affliction of Your maidservant and remember me, and not forget Your maidservant, but will give Your maidservant a male child, then I will give him to the LORD all the days of his life, and no razor shall come upon his head." As God's people, we would be richly blessed if we strived to do the same thing.

God answers the prayers of His people. James 5:16 says, "Confess your trespasses to one another, and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The effective, fervent prayer of a righteous man avails much." He may not answer in the way we want; be He does answer. If the prayers of His Son, Jesus, were answered with a "no" at times, why should we be surprised when He does the same with us (cf. Matthew 26.36-46).

God supplies us with the best that we need in each situation. Luke 11:11-13 says, "If a son asks for bread from any father among you, will he give him a stone? Or if he asks for a fish, will he give him a serpent instead of a fish? Or if he asks for an egg, will he offer him a scorpion? If you then, being evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will yourheavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him!" Since He already knows what we need before we ask (Matthew 6.8), we must trust His judgment as being exceedingly better than ours.

Hannah was able to overcome her sadness after prayer to God and encouragement from Eli(1 Samuel 1:17-18). A word of encouragement can accomplish wonders for people who are in despair. Christians should strive to help one another when they face situations

that are difficult. In bearing one another's burdens, we can edify our brethren as they face trials and tribulations in this life. Galatians 6:2 says, "Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ."

A word well-spoken is delightful to the hearer. Proverbs 25:11 says, "A word fitly spoken is like apples of gold In settings of silver." On the other hand, words poorly chosen can cause a suffering persons grief to be multiplied. Job 16:2-5 says, "I have heard many such things; Miserable comforters are you all! Shall words of wind have an end? Or what provokes you that you answer? I also could speak as you do,If your soul were in my soul's place. I could heap up words against you, And shake my head at you; But I would strengthen you with my mouth, And the comfort of my lips would relieve your grief."

Finally, and perhaps most importantly, Hannah used her blessing according to God's purposes. The condition of her blessing was that she would give her son to God for His purposes (1 Samuel 1:11). This son, Samuel, would be one of the greatest prophets, priests, and seers that the nation of Israel would ever have. Isn't it interesting to note how God uses the blessings He bestows upon people to bless others?

God blesses His people in so many ways. How are you using the money, possessions, and the physical abilities that God has given to you? More importantly, have you encouraged your children to serve the living and true God? God truly enables His people to be a blessing to others.

GOD MUST LOVE GIGGLES

A second-grade school teacher observing her little charges on the playground thought, "God must love giggles." He wants us to be joyful.

As Christians, we have so much to be happy about: our sins washed away, a new life in Jesus Christ, and a hope for eternity (Acts 2:38). In this world, many things pull people down, but the Lord brings us back up.

"Make a joyful shout" could be translated, "Shout for joy" (Psalm 100:1). It means to "shout with the force of a trumpet blast," a shout of joy that comes from the very depths of your being (cf. Luke 19:40).

May the best thing that has happened to you this year, be the worst thing that happens to you next year!
