From the Preacher's Pen

OUR GOSPEL MEETING ENDED THIS PAST THURSDAY

I want to commend all of you for making this meeting such a success. It was by your presence and the inviting of many of your family, friends, and neighbors. We know that bro. Allen did his part and it was up to us to do our part. Thank You!

Allen Webster brought to us seven messages that has helped us “Reignite the Fire” within us. It is now up to us to take those messages and put them into action. It is up to us now to be that shining light for all to see in this community and surrounding areas.

The preaching of Allen Webster in our gospel meeting has stirred our hearts and made us think soberly about how we ought to be serving our God. As I listened to him talk about taking our spiritual temperature to see where we stood in our spiritual walk, I realized that maybe we might not be where we think we are in that walk. I hope and pray that you were able to realize where you personally stood with God.

Bro. Allen also helped us to revitalize our worship to Almighty God. Worship is an act of giving honor, reverence and praise to God (and as the Greek word indicates, “to kiss toward”). This is a very individual act. This is a very personal act. Do you “worship”?

When you sing in worship, do you actually worship God? When you pray in worship, do you actually worship God? When you give in worship, do you actually worship God? When you commune in worship, do you actually worship God? When you hear God’s Word proclaimed in worship, do you actually worship God? True worship takes effort! So, do you “worship”? We should strive to be true worshippers in our worship to God, (John 4:23-24).

He also helped us in understanding how we can increase our passion and zeal for Jesus. You and I need to examine ourselves and honestly measure two things: (1) am I zealous as a Christian? and (2) why? True zeal and passion as a Christian has nothing to do with me or what I get out of it for myself, but true zeal is all about Jesus. When “the love of Christ compels us” (2 Cor. 5:14), we will boldly speak His word (Acts 4:13-31) and be truly “zealous for good works” (Tit. 2:14). Are you burning with zeal? What about your passion?

Have you found your place in the body of Christ? What can we do to be an essential part when it comes to the church/body of Christ? God’s design for His FAMILY is that each member/part (old and young) work together with all the other members/parts (old and young) to “grow up into Christ.” (Eph. 2:19,21). Finding our place in the body of Christ isn’t limited to a certain age! Every Christian must continually grow and mature in Christ. So, what can the church do to help all parts (old and young) in this growth?

Jesus commanded, “Seek first His kingdom” (Matt. 6:33). So, which is supposed to be “first” in our lives—Christ or His church? The answer is, BOTH! One cannot be first in your life without the other being first! You can’t be putting Christ first if you’re not putting His church first!

REASONS TO REJOICE

The seventy sent out by Jesus rejoiced, but they rejoiced about the wrong things. “And the seventy returned again with joy, saying, Lord, even the devils are subject unto us through thy name. And he said unto them, I beheld Satan as lightning fall from heaven. Behold, I give unto you power to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy: and nothing shall by any means hurt you. Notwithstanding in this rejoice not, that the spirits are subject unto you; but rather rejoice, because your names are written in heaven” (Luke 10:17-20). Jesus gave the right reason for rejoicing. They were to rejoice because their “names are written in heaven.” Let us rejoice:

REJOICE BECAUSE YOU ARE NEW IN CHRIST. “Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new” (2 Cor. 5:17). The obedient believer has a new relationship—“in Christ.” A Christian is something new because being in Him gives us a reflection of Divine Glory.

REJOICE BECAUSE YOUR SINS ARE FORGIVEN. “In whom we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of his grace” (Eph. 1:7). God’s forgiveness is that which enables the beginning of a new life or a beginning again for a Christian who has fallen. God’s love moved Him to send Jesus as a sacrifice for sins to make forgiveness possible. To become a child of God or to be restored to Christ sins must be forgiven. (Acts 2:36-41; 8:18-24). Forgiveness in Christ is our greatest blessing.

REJOICE BECAUSE YOU HAVE HOPE. “For we are saved by hope: but hope that is seen is not hope: for what a man seeth, why doth he yet hope for?” (Rom. 8:24). Christians are saved now, but there is salvation in a much larger sense when this earthly tabernacle is put off. Our eternal inheritance provides hope through the worst times of life. The Christians real possession is not what he sees, but what he hopes for.

REJOICE BECAUSE OF THE PROMISE OF ETERNAL LIFE. “And this is the record, that God hath given to us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. He that hath the Son hath life; and he that hath not the Son of God hath not life” (1 John 5:11-12). Eternal life is a life exempt from every kind and degree of evil, trouble or misery. Eternal life is only granted by God and eternal life is only to those in Christ. Christians have reason to rejoice. Are you faithful in God’s service? If not get right with God today and you will have reason to rejoice.
