

#### From the Preacher's Pen



#### ALL SCRIPTURE IS PROFITABLE

"But continue thou in the things which thou hast learned and hast been assured of, knowing of whom thou hast learned them; And that from a child thou hast known the holy scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus. All scripture

is given by inspiration of God and is profitable for doctrine for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: That the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works." (2 Tim. 3:14-17).

# By "all scripture," the apostle Paul includes both the Old Testament and the New Testament.

In our scripture text he encouraged Timothy to continue in the things which he had learned, and that from a child he had known the holy scriptures. Since the New Testament had not been completed when Timothy was a child, his mother and grandmother taught him the Old Testament. His mother was a Jewess: so, naturally she would have instilled the Old Testament in her son. Paul said "All scripture," which would have also included the New Testament. "Scripture" refers to "writing." Not just any writing, but all writing inspired of God. "Given by inspiration of God" is one word in the Greek New Testament "theoneustos". God breathed his word into the minds of the apostles and prophets. All Scripture is profitable because it is inspired of God. The word of God is profitable, beneficial and useful. It is relevant to every person in every place for all time.

### The Scriptures are beneficial for doctrine or teaching.

One cannot improve on the teaching of God. Jesus said, "No man can come to me, except the Father which hath sent me draw him: and I will raise him up at the last day. It is written in the prophets, And they shall be all taught of God Every man therefore that hath heard, and hath learned of the Father, cometh unto me." (John 6:44-45.) To be taught of God is to be taught his doctrine or teaching. It baffles me that some seem to think that their words are more important than God's word. Their teaching or preaching reflects it. The suggestion has been made that one should not pile scripture on top of scripture in making a point. Really? Tell that to Paul, read Romans 15:8-12. In emphasizing that the gospel is for the Gentiles as well as the Jews, Paul quotes: Psa.18:49, Deut. 32:49, Psa. 117: 1 and Isa. 11:10. It is true that one might use one verse in its proper text to support a point, but I would never discourage one from adding, "and again" "and again" "and again" "and again" to bring forth more inspired witnesses.

## The Scriptures are useful for "reproof," or correction, censure.

The Bible is valuable in refuting error, rebuking sin. We all, from time to time need to be reproved. We may need to be censured. Just as a child at times needs to be reproved, so do we as children of God. The Bible is the standard of right and wrong. When we think

wrong or do wrong God's word can reprove us, censure us. Jeremiah wrote, "Thus saith the LORD, Stand ye in the ways, and see, and ask for the old paths, where is the good way, and walk therein, and ye shall find rest for your souls. But they said, We will not walk therein." (Jer. 6:16). The Psalmist said, "The statutes of the LORD are right, rejoicing the heart: The commandment of the LORD is pure, enlightening the eyes." (Psa. 19:8).

## The Scriptures not only reprove but they correct.

They are good for correction which in this verse means "restoration to an upright or a right state." God's word gives us instruction, reproofs, and sets us upright. When we get "knocked down" by the word of God, it can set us upright. We need encouragement. There is much within God's word that encourages us to be dedicated and faithful. Knowing that we have the forgiveness of sins, the hope of eternal life and sweet fellowship with God, and all the redeemed.

#### God's word can set us upright and give instructions in righteous living.

It can help us deal with temptations (Psa. 119:11; 1 John 2:15-17; Matt. 4:1-11; 1 Cor. 10:11). It can tell us how to talk (Eph. 4: 29; Matt. 12:34-36; James 3). It can show us how to walk (1 John 1:7; Eph. 4:1-3; Col. 2:6; Psa. 1:1). It can teach us how to love (Matt. 22:37-40; I Cor. 13). It can show us how to serve (Gal. 5:6, 13). It can teach us how to do good (Gal. 6:10; James 1:27).

#### These items are useful in making us perfect (2 Tim. 3:17).

The Scriptures are able to make us "perfect" or complete, to furnish us perfectly for Christian living. It is true that these words were addressed to Timothy specifically. The Bible is able to fit and outfit him completely for the work of evangelism. And if it is able to help the preacher, it will be beneficial to all.

This passage should encourage us to be students of the Bible. Daily reading the Bible will help us. Take time each day to open your Bible and read. Note the emphasis upon reading:

"Seek ye out of the book of the LORD, and read: No one of these shall fail, None shall want her mate: For my mouth it hath commanded, And his spirit it hath gathered them." (lsa.34:16).

"So they read in the book in the law of God distinctly, and gave the sense, and caused them to understand the reading." (Neh. 8:8).

"And he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up: and, as his custom was, he went into the synagogue on the sabbath day, and stood up for to read." (Luke 4:16). "Till I come, give attendance to reading, to exhortation, to doctrine." (1 Tim. 4:13).

"Blessed is he that readeth, and they that hear the words of this prophecy, and keep those things which are written therein: for the time is at hand." (Rev. 1:3). CB
