From the Preacher's Pen

GOD DID NOT SAY, "YOU SHALL NOT USE INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC."

Sometimes men make a mistake when they come to the Bible and expect God to expressly prohibit actions which displease Him. The Mormons,

who used water in the Lord's Supper, say, "Where does the Bible say you cannot use water?" This approach to the Bible totally ignores the truth that when God expressly commands actions it disallows all other actions.

Consider the death of Nadab and Abihu, the two sons of Aaron. God had expressly told the priests to burn incense by taking "coals of fire from the altar before the Lord" (Lev. 16:12). These two sons of Aaron brought fire from another source, and God immediately sent fire from above and killed them. They failed to see that, when God expressly commands actions, the command prohibits all actions other than what He commanded.

Look at the words of Leviticus 10. These sons of Aaron "... each took his censor and put fire in it, and put incense on it and offered profane fire before the Lord, which He had not commanded them." Take special note that the Spirit does not say that they offered fire which He had said not to offer. God had not said, "You shall not use fire from other sources." Yet, they were not at liberty to do anything which God had not expressly forbidden. They were limited to doing what God had expressly commanded. Explicit commands forbid other actions.

Now, put this event in the context of the book of Leviticus. The tabernacle had been erected, but priests had not been consecrated to serve in it. In the first part of chapter eight, Aaron and his sons are consecrated to serve before God. Read chapters eight and nine, and see the emphasis placed on the commands of God. The text says, "Moses did as the Lord commanded him...what the Lord commanded to be done...as the Lord commanded Moses...as the Lord had commanded Moses...as the Lord had commanded Moses...as the Lord had commanded Moses...as I commanded...as the Lord has commanded to do...for so I have been commanded...all the things that the Lord had commanded by the hand of Moses...what Moses commanded...the thing which the Lord commanded...as the Lord commanded...as the Lord had commanded Moses" (Lev. 8:4,5,9,13,17,21,29,31,34,35,36; 9:5,6,7,10). Do you see the emphasis? What a contrast with the actions obeyed expressly as the Lord commanded, and the sin of disobedience, thinking God had to expressly forbid actions.

Take this principle and apply it. God does not have to say, "Do not use water" or "Do not use musical instruments," when He expressly tells us what to do!

God provides for our need, not for our greed!

THE GOAL OF EVERY CHRISTIAN MAN FROM A YOUNG AGE

Man of God, do you desire to be a shepherd and overseer of the Lord's church? I hope you do! God says that the man who aspires to that office "desires a good/fine work" (1 Tim. 3:1). The man who aspires to be an elder will not "accidentally" become one, nor will he "coincidentally" happen to meet the qualifications for such an office (this office can only be held by men who meet God's specifications in 1 Timothy 3:1-7, 11; Titus 1:5-9). Becoming an elder in the Lord's church is a goal that every man needs to set and then target every day. Now, are you qualified to be a shepherd/overseer?

Every question in this section below must be answered with a definitive "Yes." Which one(s) need your attention?

Are you blameless? Morally fit, nothing laid to one's charge?

Are you temperate? Evenly tempered, with self under control?

Are you sober-minded? Sensible, serious, circumspect, calm?

Are you of good behavior? Respectable, orderly, disciplined?

Are you hospitable? Kind, friendly, generous, open, warm?

Are you able to teach? Spiritually mature in knowledge & skill?

Are you gentle? Patient, equitable, courteous, peaceful?

Are you a lover of what is good? Love truth/purity, hate evil?

Are you just? Upright, honest, fair, impartial, noble?

Are you holy? Devout, pure, consecrated, undefiled by sin?

Are you holding fast the faithful word? Devoted to & clinging?

Are you well thought of by outsiders? Of good testimony?

Are you the husband of one wife? Scripturally married?

Are you over your home, with children subject to you & God?

Are you married to a woman who is reverent, temperate, faithful in all things and not a malicious gossip?

Every question in this section below must be answered with a definitive "No." Which one(s) need your attention?

Are you a novice? Recent convert, spiritually immature?

Are you given to wine? Beside it, near it, accepting of it?

Are you violent? Ready with a blow, combative, a bully?

Are you greedy for money? Covetous, inclined to material?

Are you quarrelsome? Contentious, belligerent, argumentative?

Are you self-willed? Self-pleasing, inconsiderate, arrogant?

Are you quick-tempered? Prone to anger, hotheaded, rash?

Serving as a shepherd of the Lord's church is a not a position of honor (although shepherds are to receive honor, 1 Tim. 5:17), but it is work to be desired, which requires real labor and toil to tend, feed and protect the Lord's flock!

Man of God, are you desirous? Are you qualified?
