A Day to Remember, Remembering 9-11-2001

September 11, 2001 was a very tragic day for the United States. Twenty years ago, innocent citizens of our nation were targeted and killed by Fundamental Islamic terrorists. They slammed jet planes loaded w/ passengers into the Twin Towers & the Pentagon. There was a fourth
